What is the value and impact of the Summit Community Care Clinic? You may think of the Clinic as an important healthcare option available to all members of our community. But did you know that the Care Clinic also provides over 120 jobs, with a total economic impact of \$15,029,533 which includes direct community spending of \$7,953,510 and over \$2 million in tax revenue? The Care Clinic also contributes to a 24% savings to Medicaid patients -- and in 2017 took care of over 8,000 patients. That's IMPACT!






Care Clinic Supports YESS: Youth Empowerment Society of Summit

Aided by an Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) Grant for behavioral health, the Summit Community Care Clinic is working with local high school students who are passionate about their community and supporting their peers. The members of YESS participate in local outreach organizations such as Building Hope and Advocates for Victims of Assault, and also encourage other students to avoid drug and alcohol use.

SCCC Takes the Lead in Providing Much Needed Drug Treatment Services

In 2017, more than 70,200 Americans died from drug overdose. Thanks to a Federal grant from HRSA, the Care Clinic is able to offer the only Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) program for opioid addiction in the county. Under the direction of Chief Medical Officer Dr. Kathleen Cowie (right), the program was launched in March and takes advantage of the Clinic's holistic approach to healthcare -- involving providers in the medical, dental and behavioral health departments. Patients seeking treatment will have immediate contact with a health navigator, with an expedited scheduled appointment within a week. Photo by Hugh Carey/Summit Daily. Offering Access to Dental Care for Veterans

The Summit Community Care Dental Clinic provides access to dental care for veterans through a partnership with our local Veteran's Outreach Program Specialist.
